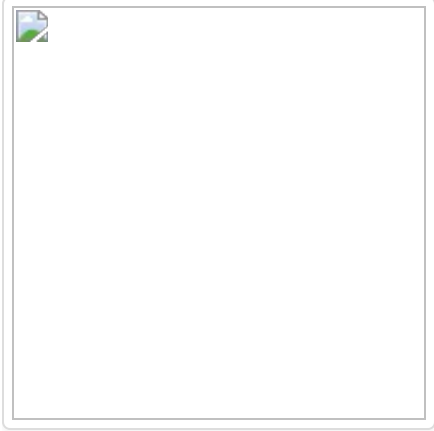




Gerald "Max" Hebb
