Kendall Dee Call, 87, of Iola, KS passed away on April 12, 2018. He was born to Clifford E and Emma L (Hackett) Call on April 7, 1931 at the family home in Mildred, KS. 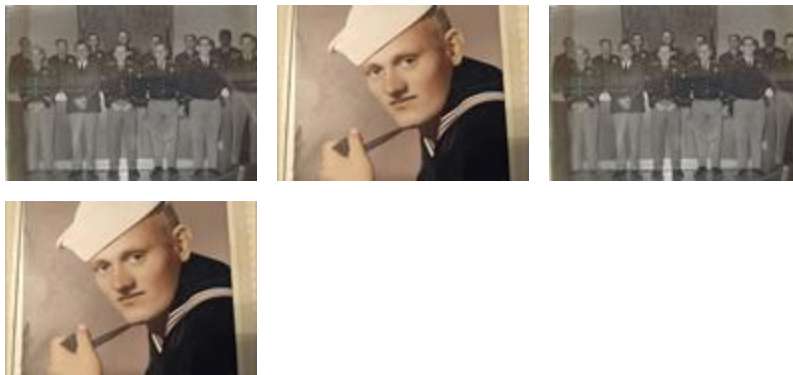

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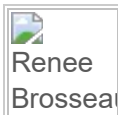
