Sylvia Ann York died Thursday, June 8, 2023. She was born on July 26, 1939 on a farm northeast of Humboldt to Frank W. and Mary (Kipp) Heiman. She attended St. Joseph's Church and parochial school in Humboldt, Sacred Heart Convent School in Wichita, and graduated from Humboldt High School in 1957.

Sylvia attended junior college in Chanute, then married Bud Cox in November of 1958. Sylvia and Bud would later divorce. On December 29, 1972, she married Paul York of Humboldt and worked at Pinecrest Nursing Home for 30 years. Paul preceded her in death on December 20, 2002.

Sylvia was preceded in death by her parents, two brothers Kenny and Bill, two sisters Betty and Marie, also by a brother-in-law, two sisters in law, and two nephews.

Sylvia is survived by her brothers Bob Heiman of Humboldt, Dan and Shirley of Oconto, WI, and Charles of Chanute.
